

Zach's Snacks

Gingerbread has an incredibly long history however it is best recognized as a candy decorated house. Gingerbread has been shaped into Christmas tree ornaments since the Victorian era. As for gingerbread houses, they became popular after the brothers Grimm published Hansel and Gretel. It's still unclear when they became incredible edible edifices.

Gingerbread may be German however egg nog is purely American, known to be enjoyed by captain john smith at Jamestown in 1607.

Egg nog also known as milk punch or egg milk punch, is a rich, chilled, sweetened, creamy dairy-based beverage traditionally made with milk and/or cream, sugar, whipped eggs, which gives it a frothy texture, and, in some contexts, include spirits such as brandy, rum or bourbon.

Fruitcake is a cake made with chopped candied fruit and/or dried fruit, nuts, and spices, and soaked in spirits. The earliest recipe from ancient Rome lists pomegranate seeds, pine nuts, and raisins that were mixed into barley mash. In the middle ages, honey, spices, and preserved fruits were added. Fruit cakes are typically served in celebration of weddings and Christmas. Fruitcakes became Americanized with the addition of colonial sugar. In the 16th century fruit cakes were baked with excessive preserved fruit. High concentrations of sugar helped preserve the fruit and therefore made fruitcakes more sweet and inexpensive and therefore more popular.

No Christmas food is more recognizable than the candy cane.

According to folklore, in 1670, in cologne, Germany, the choirmaster at cologne cathedral, wishing to remedy the noise caused by children in his church during the living crèche tradition of Christmas eve, asked a local candy maker for some sweet sticks for them. In order to justify the practice of giving candy to children during worship services, he asked the candy maker to add a crook to the top of each stick, which would help children remember the shepherds who visited the infant Jesus. In addition, he used the white color of the converted sticks to teach children about the Christian belief in the sinless life of Jesus.


